#### From the Pastor's Desk

One aspect of living a faithful life as a Christian entails serving those in need. At Emmanuel we provide opportunities for exercising a ministry of service. I think of the Community Meals, and the Personal Care and School Kits we assemble for Lutheran World Relief. Our youth serve others when they participate in our summer Mission Trip. There is "behind the scenes" service that our members provide those who are in need in our congregation: visiting with home communion, phone calls, making and delivering home-made greeting cards to shut-ins.

For many of our members service is not limited to ministries directly provided by the church. I am constantly amazed and gratified when I hear of the ways people volunteer their time in our community. We have volunteers at the hospitals, packing food at the Council of Churches Food Hub, serving at Water Street Mission, helping at local museums such as North Museum and Landis Valley Farm Museum, and lot of others. There was a time when I worried that we weren't providing enough opportunities for service directly at Emmanuel. But then I realized how much we serve through our members actively engaged in various service related organizations in our community.

My own way of serving in the community has been to be involved in the Lancaster County Council of Churches. I currently chair their board of directors which oversees the work of the Council. You may have recently read in the Lancaster News Paper that the Council of Churches announced a change in name. From now on we will be known as The Lancaster County Food Hub-Serving With Faith and Compassion. The name reflects more clearly the mission and work of the organization. We are an organization which focuses on meeting the needs of those who are food insecure in our community. Last year we served over 30,000 individual distributions of just under a million pounds of food.

While food is at the heart of The Food Hub, we also provide a Clothing Bank, the Women's Winter Shelter, and the Wheels to Work program. We are still a clothing bank which received donations of clothes and gives them away free without cost. Donated cars are fixed up and then sold at far below market value to qualified persons who have a job but no other means of transportation. This makes us different that other charitable organizations (like WITF) that receive a car and sell it for the proceeds. The Food Hub, Clothing Bank, and Shelter are all staffed with volunteers and are wonderful places to serve the community and meet others who have a heart for service. 
#### "Raise the Roof" Seeks Gifts for Needed Chapel Roof Replacement

A fund-raising appeal was authorized at the May Congregational Meeting to replace the aging and leaking asphalt-shingle chapel roof as well as repair crumbling mortar in the church bell tower. The goal of the appeal is \$60,000.

Congregational members will be invited to pledge toward the "Raise the Roof" appeal later in the month of June or early July. More detailed information will be mailed to each member.

The term of the pledge campaign will be two years beginning in August, 2019 and continue through July, 2021.

The repairs are needed to be completed soon, before all of the money from the pledge campaign is received. We will need to borrow funds to pay for the repairs and the loan will be repaid as the pledged money is received. If anyone is interested in loaning a portion or all of the money to Emmanuel, which would be paid back over two years, please contact Mark Moffett, the Financial Secretary.


